About Our Education Fund

The Oregon Columbia NECA Board of Directors allocates an annual education fund.

The First Year

Become a NECA member and in the first year, your company will receive an initial \$1,000 credit from our Education Fund for educational expenses.

Moving Forward

Subsequently, you receive a portion of that designated amount based on your company's average hours worked. For instance, if the board designates \$500,000 for the education fund and your company's average hours account for 1% of the total hours worked in our jurisdiction, you would receive 1% of the \$500,000, equivalent to \$5,000.
